7. Education

In Japan, attending elementary and junior high school is mandatory.

The school year runs from April to March of the following year.

Elementary School (6 years): Ages 6 to 12 (Enrollment starts the April after turning 6).

Junior High School (3 years): Ages 12 to 15 (Enrollment starts the April after turning 12).

For children of foreign nationality, school attendance is not mandatory, but they can attend municipal elementary and junior high schools if they wish.

In Japanese schools, the grade level is determined by the child's birth date, so it may differ from the grade level in schools in their home country.

Children of foreign nationality living in Japan can receive the same free education as Japanese children if they wish to enroll in public elementary and junior high schools.

①Entering School [Enrollment Procedures]

Around October of the previous year, the Miyazaki City Board of Education sends enrollment applications to the guardians of children who will enter elementary and junior high schools the next year.

If you wish to enroll, please submit the completed enrollment application to the Board of Education.

Schools are designated based on the address in the Basic Resident Register, and admission notifications are sent out by the end of January.

Please submit the admission notification on the day of the entrance ceremony.

②When Moving [Transfer Procedures]

If there are school-age children in your household and you wish to transfer them to a municipal elementary or junior high school, please inform the Citizen's Registration Management Division when submitting your change of residence notification.

The Miyazaki City Board of Education will notify eligible families. Please visit the School Education Division and submit the necessary application forms for enrollment. Schools are designated based on the address in the basic resident register, and an admission notification will be issued.

Please submit the admission notification at the school office.

3 Costs

Children of foreign nationality living in Japan can receive the same free education as Japanese children if they wish to enroll in public elementary and junior high schools. However, there are fees for materials and school lunches.

①What is a night school?

The student body is diverse, ranging from teenagers to senior citizens, and includes people who work during the day and attend school at night.

It's also open to foreigners who haven't completed their compulsory education either in Japan or their home country.



3Eligibility

- People who haven't graduated from junior high or those who graduated but couldn't study properly (including those born overseas)
- Residents of Miyazaki Prefecture who can attend in person
