Miyazaki City Ordinance on the Prohibition of Acts of Solicitation





In areas where solicitation is prohibited,

- 1 It is prohibited to solicit/wait for customers
- 2 It is prohibited to recruit (scout) wait around to recruit
- 3 It is prohibited for businesses to use solicitation


※ For 1 and 2, the act of "doing" and the act of "making someone do" are prohibited.



Business operators are asked to comply with the prohibition regulations and provide guidance and supervision to their employees regarding the prohibition of soliciting customers, etc.



Citizens and tourists should firmly refuse any attempts at solicitation and recruiting and should avoid using them.



orders to offenders to tell them not to commit violations. If they do not obey the orders, we will impose a fine of up to 50,000 yen and

publish their name, address, and the store's name.

In addition, not only the offender, but the store or business that engaged in solicitation will also be subject to guidance, warnings, orders, fines, and public announcements.

STOP Acts of Solicitation



Encouraging Recruitment



The act of identifying a specific person among passersby or an unidentified group of people and encouraging them to engage in certain work or services.

Waiting to Solicit or Encourage



The act of waiting and watching for potential targets in order to conduct solicitation/recruitment.

Business Using Solicitation



The act of letting customers into a store who were invited by someone engaged in solicitation activities.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this ordinance, other laws and regulations may apply, such as the Act on Control and Improvement of Amusement Business, etc. and the Miyazaki Prefecture Ordinance for the Prevention of Nuisance Acts.

Not Prohibited







If these acts potentially involve identifying specific individuals in a public place and inviting them to become customers or to engage in certain work, they will be considered as solicitation or encouraging recruitment.
